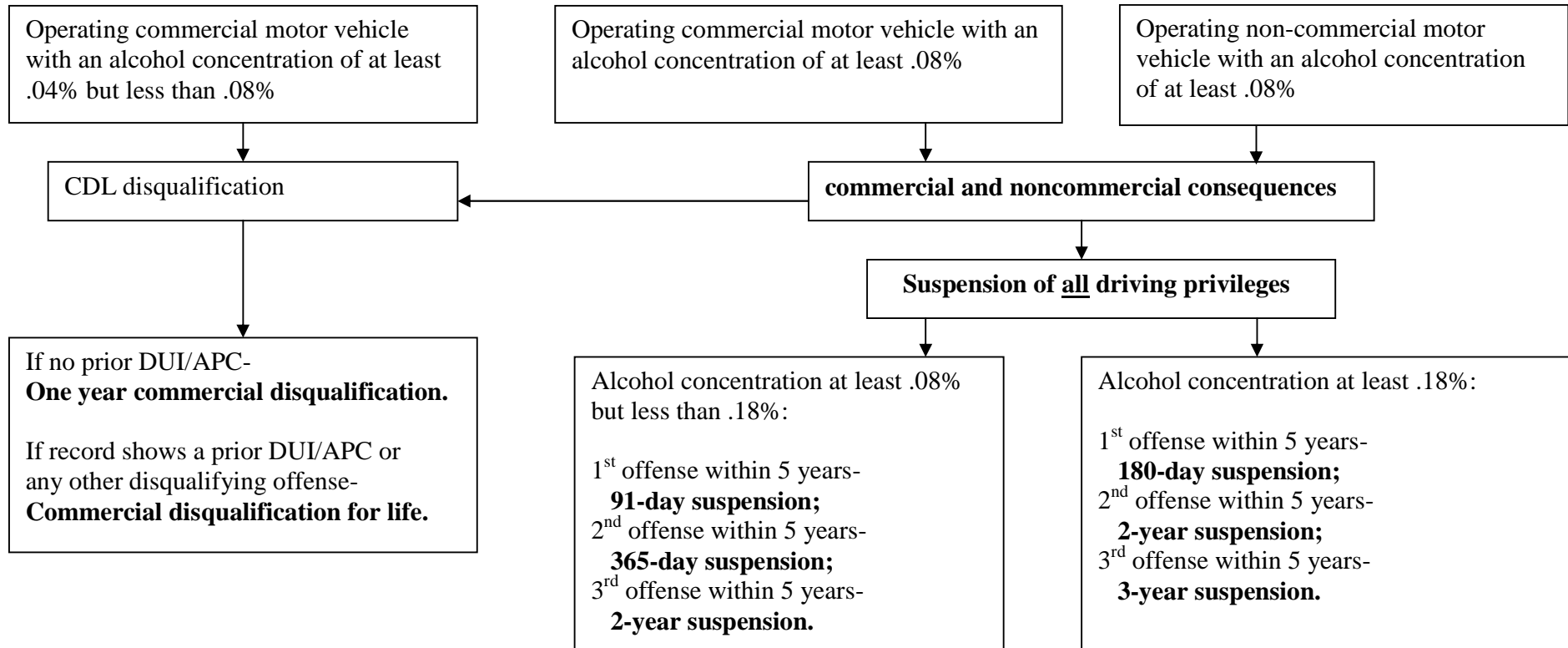


Suspension and Disqualification Periods for Drivers with Commercial Drivers Licenses (CDL)



Refusal to submit to testing in a commercial or non-commercial vehicle requires disqualification for one year or, if the record shows any prior disqualifying offense, for life.

It bears repeating that an implied consent suspension resulting from the operation of a noncommercial motor vehicle with an alcohol concentration of .08% or greater requires commercial disqualification for one year or, if the record shows any prior disqualifying offense, for life.

("DUI" means driving under the influence of alcohol.
"APC" means being in actual physical control of a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol.)

NO COMMERCIAL TEMPORARY RESTRICTED LICENSE OR "WORK PERMIT" WILL BE ISSUED FOR THE OPERATION OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES AFTER AN ALCOHOL RELATED SUSPENSION, REVOCATION OR DISQUALIFICATION.
