

Legal Name Requirements

Do I have to use my legal name when applying for a title?

Yes. State law requires all applicants to use their legal name when making an application for certificate of title and registration to a motor vehicle.

How do I prove my legal name?

Your legal name can be verified by providing one of the following:

- A valid state-issued driver's license
- Non-driver Identification card
- Other documentary evidence that confirms the true legal identity of the owner

Do I have to send in a copy of my driver's license or ID card?

Applicants with an out-of-state driver's license or non-driver identification must provide a legible copy of the card.

I don't have a driver's license or identification card, what do I need?

A paper copy of any other documentary evidence that confirms your legal name will be required.

Does a business, trust, or corporation need to provide legal proof?

Yes. Documentary evidence is required to confirm the legal name. The owner can provide one of the following documents including but not limited to:

- Secretary of State filing
- Top section of the state or federal tax return in the business name
- Business letterhead
- Utility bill(s) in the business
- Vehicle insurance card in the name of the business
- Appropriate page within a trust agreement confirming legal name
