### CHAPTER 37-14-01 AUTHORITY FOR REINSTATEMENT

Section 37-14-01-01 State and Federal Authority

## 37-14-01-01. State and Federal Authority.

- <u>The director is authorized to establish guidelines, including conditions, under which a</u> <u>disqualification of CDL driving privileges for life under subsections 3, 9, 11, and 13 of</u> <u>North Dakota Century Code section 39-06.2-10 may be reduced to a period of not</u> <u>less than ten years. A violation under section 39-06.2-10(14) is not eligible for</u> <u>reinstatement of a lifetime disqualification.</u>
- 2. <u>This authority is adopted from 49 CFR 383.51(6)-Reinstatement after lifetime</u> <u>disqualification.</u>

### CHAPTER 37-14-02 QUALIFICATIONS FOR REINSTATEMENT

<u>Section</u> <u>37-14-02-01</u> Application for Reinstatement <u>37-14-02-02</u> Decision for Reinstatement

#### 37-14-02-01. Application for reinstatement.

- <u>The driver may apply to the North Dakota Department of Transportation for</u> reinstatement of lifetime commercial driving privileges. The approval is subject to the discretion of the director and subject to the following requirements:
  - a. <u>The request cannot be made prior to ten years from the effective date of the</u> <u>lifetime disqualification.</u>
  - b. The driver must submit the request on a form prescribed by the director.
  - c. <u>The driver must submit a medical report to the director with the request for</u> <u>reinstatement.</u>
  - d. If the driving record contains alcohol or drug-related convictions, the driver must complete or have completed an alcohol/drug evaluation and complete or have completed any recommended treatment. Evidence of a completed evaluation and treatment must be provided with the application for reinstatement.
  - e. <u>Within the ten years preceding the request, the driver cannot have any of the</u> <u>following traffic violations:</u>
    - i. Drug or alcohol violations,
    - ii. Leaving the scene violations,
    - iii. Felonies involving the use of any motor vehicle, or,
    - iv. Any convictions while operating a commercial motor vehicle.

#### 37-14-02-02. Decision for reinstatement.

- 1. <u>If the decision is made to reinstate the driving privilege, prior to reinstatement the</u> <u>driver must complete the following:</u>
  - a. The driver must pay all outstanding reinstatement fees,
  - b. Meet all outstanding reinstatement requirements, and,
  - c. Pass the required knowledge, vision, and skills tests to obtain the North Dakota CDL license.
  - d. <u>Successfully complete the National Safety Council DDC Attitudinal Dynamics of</u> <u>Driving</u>,
  - e. <u>Successfully complete the DDC Professional Truck Drivers course, and,</u>
  - f. Complete any other courses or requirements required by the director.
- 2. When the initial lifetime disqualification is based on alcohol or drugs, the driver must participate in the 24/7 program for three months.
  - a. The three months period starts on the effective date of the reinstatement.
  - b. Failure to successfully complete the program will result in the loss of the reinstatement.
  - c. <u>The driver will not be eligible again for reinstatement of the original CDL lifetime</u> <u>disqualification.</u>
- 3. <u>Once reinstated, a driver will be subject to loss of reinstatement of the lifetime ban if</u> <u>involved in one of the following traffic violations, regardless of whether the violation</u> <u>occurs in a commercial or noncommercial vehicle.</u>
  - a. Violations involving drugs or alcohol,
  - b. Violations involving leaving the scene, or,
  - c. <u>Violations or felonies involving the use of any motor vehicle.</u>
  - d. Failure to satisfy this requirement will result in the loss of the reinstatement.

e. The driver will not be eligible again for reinstatement of the original CDL lifetime

disqualification.
