## **NDDOT provides wireless Internet at visitors' centers and rest areas**

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) is providing wireless Internet (WiFi) for public use at 14 visitors' centers/rest areas along Interstate I-29 and I-94 and other major roadways in North Dakota.

WiFi certified access points are used, which are compatible with most wireless-enabled devices used today. Users simply scan for availability and connect to the internet. No login name, password or cost is involved.

Signs will be posted inside visitors' centers/rest areas to inform the public of the WiFi service and direct them to information about the Department of Transportation, Game and Fish and Tourism.

The coverage at each visitor's center/rest area includes the lobby and the car and truck parking lot. WiFi is currently available at the following visitors' centers/rest areas:

### I-94

- Visitor's center in Beach
- Hailstone Creek visitors' centers (Eastbound & Westbound) west of New Salem
- Apple Creek visitors' centers (Eastbound & Westbound) east of Bismarck
- Jamestown visitors' centers (Eastbound & Westbound) west of Jamestown
- Rest area east of Oriska

### I-29

- Lake Agassiz visitor's center south of Wahpeton
- Elm River visitors' centers (Eastbound & Westbound) north of Fargo
- Alexander Henry visitor's center north of Grand Forks

### US-2

- Crary/Heftie rest area east of Devils Lake

### US-83

- Lewis and Clark Information Center in Washburn
