Public Input Meeting to be held on November 7 to discuss proposed improvements to the Intersection of U.S. Highway 2 (West Dakota Parkway) and 11th Street in Williston

A Public Input Meeting will be held from 6 to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, November 7, at Williston Community Library; 1302 Davidson Dr., Williston, ND. The Public Input Meeting will utilize an open house format, plus a short presentation will be given at 6:30 p.m.

The purpose of the Public Input Meeting is to discuss proposed improvements alternatives for the intersection of U.S. Highway 2 and 11th Street. These improvements will include: intersection realignment and geometric improvements, reconfigured access to adjacent streets, roadway reconstruction, new traffic signals, and pedestrian facilities. The Public Input Meeting will provide opportunity for public input. Representatives from Civil Science, Inc., NDDOT, and the City of Williston will be available to answer questions on the proposed project.
