ND Highway 32 closed 15 miles north of US Highway 2 due to flooding, water also on ND 32 in three areas north of US 2

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) has closed ND Highway 32 approximately 15 miles north of the junction of US Highway 2 (mile marker 174) due to flooding on the roadway. Motorists are advised to take alternate routes. There is water on the roadway of ND Highway 32 in three other areas north of US Highway 2 near Lankin.

The three additional areas on ND 32 include:

- Water running over the road approximately 6 miles north of US 2 junction (mile marker 169).
- Water running over the road approximately 14 miles north of US 2 junction (mile marker 178).
- Large amount of water on roadway, no cars allowed – only pickups and trucks, approximately two miles north of ND 32 junction to Fordville (mile marker 181).

Motorists are advised to slow down and use caution while traveling, as vehicles that leave the roadway may become immersed in water. The NDDOT encourages motorists to check road conditions before traveling due to rapidly changing conditions. Please be advised that road condition information on 511 and the travel map is updated daily from 5 a.m. until 9 p.m. CDT. The road report is based upon the information available to the NDDOT at the time of preparation and is provided solely as a public service. Conditions may vary from those reported.
