## **ND Highway 32 is now open 15 miles north of US Highway 2, water remains on ND 32 in three areas**

**Motorists advised to watch for water on roadways due to  
flooding in northeast region of the state**

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) has now opened ND Highway 32 approximately 15 miles north of the junction of US Highway 2 (mile marker 174). There is water on the roadway of ND Highway 32 in three other areas north of US Highway 2 near Lankin.

The three additional areas on ND 32 include:

- Water running over the road approximately 6 miles north of US 2 junction (mile marker 169).
- Water running over the road approximately 14 miles north of US 2 junction (mile marker 178).
- Large amount of water on roadway, no cars allowed – only pickups and trucks, approximately two miles north of ND 32 junction to Fordville (mile marker 181).

**NDDOT would like to alert motorists that overland flooding may cause water to be on a number of highways tonight and over the next several days in the northeast region of the state.** Fluctuating water levels make it difficult to predict when and where water will go over a roadway or recede from the roadway. The northeast region includes highways in the following areas: Grand Forks, Park River, Grafton, Cavalier and Pembina.

**Motorists are advised to slow down and use caution while traveling, as vehicles that leave the roadway may become immersed in water.** The NDDOT encourages motorists to check road conditions before traveling due to rapidly changing conditions. Please be advised that road condition information on 511 and the travel map is updated daily from 5 a.m. until 9 p.m. CDT.
