## Federal Highway document for Dickinson Bypass available for viewing

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has issued a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) regarding the construction of a bypass on the northwest side of the City of Dickinson. In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 it has been determined that the preferred alternative will have no significant impact on the environment. The preferred alternative route for the Dickinson Bypass has been identified as Alternative 5A. This will involve an interim build constructed from Hwy 22 to I-94 and 113<sup>th</sup> Ave SW interchange and the ultimate build will be constructed from Hwy 22 to approximately 2,800 feet south of 116<sup>th</sup> Ave SW and I-94 interchange.

This FONSI is based on the January 2013 Environmental Assessment which has been independently evaluated by FHWA and determined to adequately and accurately discuss the need, environmental issues and impacts of the proposed project, and appropriate mitigation measures.
