ND Highway 200, four miles east of Hurdsfield now open

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) and the North Dakota Highway Patrol have opened ND Highway 200, four miles east of Hurdsfield. A temporary grade raise with a single lane is in place. Motorists must stop and take turns and reduce speeds while traveling through the area. Motorists may encounter brief delays.

The following highways are affected by flood waters, but remain open to traffic, with traffic speeds reduced:

- US Highway 83, nine miles north of Max.
- ND Highway 53, east of Max.
- ND Highway 200, four miles west of Hurdsfield.

Fluctuating water levels make it difficult to predict when and where water will go over a roadway or recede from the roadway. The NDDOT encourages motorists to check road conditions before traveling due to rapidly changing conditions.
