No Travel Advisory extended to eastern North Dakota

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) and the North Dakota Highway Patrol have extended the **No Travel Advisory** to include areas in eastern North Dakota due to near zero visibility with blowing and drifting snow. Cities included in the No Travel Advisory are: Devils Lake, Jamestown, Valley City, Fargo, Grand Forks and surrounding areas. Motorists in these areas should **not travel** as blowing and drifting snow is creating hazardous driving conditions.

Motorists should be aware the following advisories are still in effect:

- A **No Travel Advisory** is in effect for portions of north central ND. Cities included in the No Travel Advisory are: Minot, Harvey, Bottineau, Crosby, Stanley, Bowbells, New Town and surrounding areas.
- A **Travel Alert** remains in effect for Bismarck and surrounding areas.

Motorists should slow down and drive according to conditions as there are still many areas in the state with severe snow drifts blocking roads and areas of low visibility. Poor visibility continues to affect highways in North Dakota. Be prepared to adjust your driving with changing road conditions.
