NDDOT to hold Ford Driving Skills for Life traffic safety event in Fargo

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) will be holding the “Ford Driving Skills for Life” event Saturday, June 9, at the Armed Forces Reserve Center in Fargo. The event is open to teenage drivers between the ages of 14 and 18 who have a valid learner’s permit or drivers license. Two sessions of the “Ford Driving Skills for Life” event will be held, the first will be from 8 a.m. to noon and the second will run from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

The “Ford Driving Skills for Life” program is one of the nation’s most comprehensive teen driver safety programs, allowing participants to be involved in multiple traffic safety activities. Participants will have the opportunity to drive through a challenging course with the Cass County Sheriff Deputies and experience a variety of interactive simulators.

The deadline to register is Sunday, May 13, at 11:59 p.m. and is limited to 65 students. If the registration limit is exceeded, participants will be randomly drawn.
