Motorists advised to watch for water on highways in northeast region due to overland flooding tonight and next several days

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) would like to alert motorists that overland flooding may cause water to be on a number of highways tonight and over the next several days in the northeast region of the state. Fluctuating water levels make it difficult to predict when and where water will go over a roadway or recede from the roadway. The northeast region includes highways in the following areas: Grand Forks, Park River, Grafton, Cavalier and Pembina.

Due to high water near roadways in some areas across the state, motorists are encouraged to use caution while traveling, vehicles that leave the roadway may become immersed in water.

The NDDOT encourages motorists to check road conditions before traveling due to rapidly changing conditions. For updated road information, call 511 from any type of phone or go to the Travel Information Map on our website at www.dot.nd.gov.

Please be advised that road condition information on 511 and the travel map is updated daily from 5 a.m. until 9 p.m. CDT. The road report is based upon the information available to the NDDOT at the time of preparation and is provided solely as a public service. Conditions may vary from those reported.
