Traffic temporarily reduced to one lane on I-94 west of Grant Marsh Bridge in Mandan for sign replacement starting Monday

Work will begin Monday, September 30, to replace an overhead sign on I-94 west of the Grant Marsh Bridge in Mandan. Starting at 7 p.m. on Monday, one lane of the westbound roadway will be closed for a few hours to allow for the work. Motorists should also be advised that on Wednesday, October 2, both westbound lanes will be temporarily closed beginning at 2 a.m. for a brief period. Motorists should expect delays at this time.

During the project:

- Speeds will be reduced to 40 mph through the lane closure
- 12 foot width restriction will be in place
- Flaggers will be present
- Both westbound lanes will be temporarily closed to traffic Wednesday, October 2, at 2 a.m. for approximately 20 minutes

Help prevent work zone crashes. Motorists are encouraged to slow down, allow extra distance between their vehicles and the vehicle in front of them, use caution and obey flaggers and posted signs.
