Applications are being accepted for \$1.7 million in federal capital aid for public transportation in North Dakota

Applications for public transportation (transit) federal capital aid grant program in North Dakota are currently being accepted by the North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT).

Applications are being accepted for \$1.7 million in federal transit grants. The funds are provided by the Federal Transit Administration and administered by the North Dakota Department of Transportation. Funds are available to agencies providing public transit service in North Dakota.

\$ 460,713 is available to fund Urban Transit providers - 5339 capital

\$ 1,247,500 is available to fund rural Transit providers in rural areas - 5339 capital

All public transit operators and providers are encouraged to apply. Individuals are not eligible for these funds.

NDDOT Transit program gives public notice that it complies with the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all related statutes.
