Reminder that seasonal load restrictions will go into effect on North Dakota state highways this spring

Seasonal load restriction will be placed on North Dakota state highway this spring. The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) normally places load restrictions on some state highways from March to May, depending on weather. However, load limits have been put into effect as early as mid-February some years. Restrictions are lifted when roadbeds have stabilized enough to carry normal traffic.

Truckers should consider moving their heavy loads before load restrictions are placed on North Dakota state highways this spring.

The highways with restricted legal load limits (solid green on the color map), as well as all other restricted highways, will require ton-mile fees when non-reducible loads exceed restricted weight limits.
