I-29 OPENED from Grand Forks to Canadian border; No Travel Advisory LIFTED for northeast ND

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) along with the North Dakota Highway Patrol have **OPENED** I-29 (all lanes) from Grand Forks to the Canadian Border.

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) along with the North Dakota Highway Patrol have **LIFTED** No Travel Advisory for northeast North Dakota including the cities of Grand Forks, Drayton, and the surrounding area.

A **Travel Alert** remains in effect for the following areas due to blowing snow causing areas of reduced visibility and snow covered roads:

- Jamestown, Valley City, Edgeley, Ashley, Ellendale, and surrounding areas.

A **Travel Alert** means conditions are such that **motorists can still travel** in these areas, but should be advised of rapidly changing conditions. Motorists are encouraged to reduce speeds and drive according to the conditions. All travelers are encouraged to monitor road conditions as weather conditions occur and use caution while traveling. For road information, call 511 from any type of phone or go to the website: www.dot.nd.gov. NDDOT releases information to inform the public about travel conditions throughout the state.

Please be advised that road condition information on 511 and the travel map is updated daily from 5 a.m. until 9 p.m. CDT. The road report is based upon the information available to the NDDOT at the time of preparation and is provided solely as a public service. Conditions may vary from those reported.
