Traffic to be moved to a newly paved lane on US Highway 85 near McKenzie County Road 30 south of Watford City beginning Sept. 6

Road work crews will shift a work zone and traffic will be moved to an adjacent road lane on US Highway 85 near McKenzie County Road 30 south of Watford City beginning Saturday, September 6. The traffic shift will extend for about a mile south of McKenzie County Road 30.

Traffic will be rerouted and will be head to head for lane work in the area. This is part of the Southwest Watford City Bypass project.

During construction:

- Traffic will be head to head
- Speeds will be reduced to 25 mph
- Motorists should expect delays
- Flaggers will be in place as needed

The lane restriction will be in place for two weeks.
