ND Highway 200 near Fairview to be reduced to one lane beginning Monday, September 21

Beginning Monday, September 21, traffic will be reduced to one lane on ND Highway 200 east of Fairview from the Montana border to the ND Highway 58/200 intersection to allow crews to perform asphalt work. Motorists will take turns traveling through the area.

Beginning on Saturday, September 26, 161st Avenue NW will be closed from near the ND Highway 200 intersection south to 2nd Street to allow crews to perform pipe and pavement work. This work is part of a project which consists of a roundabout at the intersection of the ND Highway 200 and ND Highway 58 with new lighting at the roundabout, full road reconstruction from the Montana border to approximately 3 miles east along ND Highway 200, and pavement overlay east to the project's end, excluding the Yellowstone Bridge.

During construction:

- A 12-foot width restriction will be in place from the Montana border to County Road 1 near Cartwright
- Speeds are currently reduced to 25 mph from near the ND Highway 58/200 intersection to the Yellowstone Bridge
- Speeds are currently reduced to 20 mph on the temporary roadways at the ND Highway 58/200 intersection
- Flaggers will be in place
- Motorists should be prepared to stop

ND Highway 200 is expected to be reduced to one lane for approximately two weeks. 161st Avenue NW is expected to reopen in October.

The NDDOT Williston District serves the transportation needs of the communities in northwestern North Dakota, including Williston, Alexander, Watford City, New Town, Stanley, and Berthold. NDDOT has been working very hard to build new bypasses, expand roadways, and provide roadway improvements to enhance traffic movement.
