NDDOT seeking public comment on draft of statewide Planning and Programming public involvement activities

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) is currently seeking comment on the draft of the “Public and Non-metropolitan Local Official Participation Plan” for Statewide Planning and Programming Activities. The intent of this document is to provide guidance in the public involvement process related to the NDDOT’s statewide planning and programming activities. Additionally, this document is intended to serve as the guide for involving non-metropolitan local officials and interested parties in the statewide transportation planning and programming public involvement process.

The combined purpose of this document is intended to meet the public and non-metropolitan local government official involvement requirements as prescribed by 23 Code of Federal Regulations (CRF) 450.210.
