No Travel Advisory issued for portions of northeast North Dakota

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) and the North Dakota Highway Patrol (NDHP) have issued a **No Travel Advisory** for portions of northeast North Dakota including I-29 from Buxton north to the Canadian Border and ND Highway 2 from Michigan to Grand Forks due to high winds causing blowing and drifting snow, icy conditions and near zero visibility which is creating hazardous driving conditions. Conditions are such that motorists in this area should **NOT** travel. The **No Travel Advisory** includes the cities of Cavalier, Drayton, Michigan, Grand Forks, Cooperstown and surrounding areas.

All travelers are encouraged to monitor road conditions as weather conditions occur and use caution while traveling. For road information, call 511 from any type of phone or go to the website: www.dot.nd.gov.

The NDDOT works hard to keep travelers informed of road conditions. However, the road conditions are not reported 24 hours a day but updated every day from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. Central Time, including holidays. It's important to remember that the conditions may vary from what is being reported.
