2024 Reconnecting Communities Pilot Discretionary Grant

Program Description – The purpose of the RCP Program is 1) to advance community-centered transportation connection projects, with a priority for projects that benefit disadvantaged communities, that improve access to daily needs such as jobs, education, healthcare, food, nature, and recreation, and foster equitable development and restoration, and 2) to provide technical assistance to further these goals.

The RCP Program provides grant funding and technical assistance for planning and capital construction to address infrastructure barriers, restore community connectivity, and improve peoples' lives. The variety of transformative solutions to knit communities back together can include infrastructure removal, pedestrian walkways and overpasses, capping and lids, roadway redesigns, complete streets conversions, and main street revitalization.

After completing the merit review, DOT will prioritize projects that demonstrate the extent to which the project will further the following priorities: (1) Safety; (2) Transformation; (3) Thriving Communities

Eligible Activities and Costs (NOFO pg. 4)

Planning Grants fund the study of removing, retrofitting, or mitigating an existing facility to restore community connectivity; conduct public engagement; and other transportation planning activities.

Capital Construction Grants are to carry out a project to remove, retrofit, mitigate, or replace an existing eligible facility with a new facility that reconnects communities.

Application & Narrative Requirements -

All applicants must submit the following Standard Forms (SF):

- All applicants must submit the Application for Federal Assistance (SF-424)
- **Planning Grants:** Budget Information for Non-Construction Programs (SF-424A), Assurances for Non-Construction Programs (SF-424B)
- Capital Construction Grants: Budget Information for Construction Programs (SF-424C), Assurances for Construction Programs (SF-424D)

For Planning Grants, the narrative should not exceed 10 pages; for Capital Grants the narrative should not exceed 20 pages. Standard formatting: i.e., single-spaced, standard 12-point such as Times New Roman, 1-inch margins and page numbers.
