

## FY23 Safe Streets and Roads for All Funding (SS4A)

This is only a summary; applicants should <u>not</u> rely on it to meet application requirements. Study the full grant opportunity announcement before applying for any federal grant.

**Program Description** – The purpose of SS4A grants is to improve roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries through safety action plan development and refinement and implementation focused on all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, public transportation users, motorists, personal conveyance and micromobility users, and commercial vehicle operators.

**SS4A Grant Priorities** – Promote safety to prevent death and serious injuries on public roadways; • Employ low-cost, high-impact strategies that can improve safety over a wide geographic area; • Ensure equitable investment in the safety needs of underserved communities, which includes both underserved urban and rural communities; • Incorporate evidence-based projects and strategies and adopt innovative technologies and strategies; • Demonstrate engagement with a variety of public and private stakeholders; and • Align with the Department's mission and Strategic Goals such as safety; climate change and sustainability; equity and Justice40; and workforce development, job quality, and wealth creation..

## **Eligible Activities –**

- A. Developing a comprehensive safety action plan or Action Plan (i.e., the activities in Table 1, as well as the supplemental planning and demonstration activities described in Section A.2);
- B. Conducting planning, design, and development activities for projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan; and
- C. Carrying out projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan.

**Eligible Project Costs** – Eligible activity costs must comply with the cost principles set forth in 2 CFR, Subpart E (i.e., 2 CFR § 200.403 and § 200.405)



**Application & Narrative Requirements** – The application must include the following: Standard Forms (SF-424); Key Information Questions; Project Narrative (2 page max) and Summary Budget Narrative.
