Program Description	RAISE Grants are for investments in surface transportation that will have a significant local or regional impact, invest efficiently and equitably, promote the competitiveness of the U.S. economy, improve job opportunities by focusing on high labor standards, strengthen infrastructure resilience to all hazards including climate change,.		
Eligible Capital Projects (pgs 10-11)	Highway, bridge, or other road; public transportation; passenger and freight rail transportation; port infrastructure; surface transportation components of an airport; intermodal; replace/ rehabilitate a culvert; projects on Tribal land; non-motorized projects and intermodal projects.
