JUNE 13, 2025 BID OPENING UPDATE

- All projects awarded except for 23720
 - Pending County Concurrence
- No DBE Goals
 - Overall DBE Participation 9.92% adjusted for FAS
 - Total to DBEs: \$1.4M – DBE Prime on 24089

JULY 18, 2025 BID OPENING

- 3 Federal Aid Projects
 - 24595 is NOT Federally Funded – No DBE requirements apply
 - No DBE Goals – until October 1, 2025
- Currently at 4.04% Overall DBE Participation for October 1, 2024 – July 1, 2025
 - Updated 2024-2026 DBE Triennial Goal as of March 2025 is 3.48%
 - Still to be counted: August 15th Bid Opening and April through September Consultant/Other Projects
